In a time when businesses are downsizing or closing their doors and many of our citizens are finding themselves out of work, there is still one place they can go to get help and it's FREE! The Amador County Library and its programs offer an amazing amount of resources to the public. Internet access is available for job search and filing for unemployment benefits. Study books for test taking such as the ASVAB, Math, English, GED, GMAT, SAT, and more.

The Literacy/Lifeskills Program helps adults with reading improvement, GED studies, job skills such as resume writing, and computer basics which includes, learning the keyboard, mouse, e-mail, and searching the Internet and online library resources.

I encourage everyone to visit the library, get a library card, if you don't already have one, and enjoy our FREE resources. You can join our book clubs, one in Jackson, one in Plymouth, one in Pioneer, or bring your knitting and join our "Just Knits" group. There is something for everyone.

Modern World Nations

The library hopes to enhance the Children's collection with the purchase of "Modern World Nations." This series, a set of 71 volumes, is geared towards students in Grades 5-12, and covers the government, people, culture, economy and history of countries around the world. The complete set, including handling, costs \$2,220.41. The Sutter Creek Woman's Club has recently awarded the library \$450 for this purchase. With this award and an anonymous \$300 donation, the library still needs \$1,470.41 to complete the purchase.
